38. *Obv.* M. ANTONINVS AVG. TR.P. XXVII. Laureate head to right.
Rev. RESTITVTORI ITALIAE IMP. VI. COS. III. The emperor standing to left, extending his right hand to a kneeling figure of Italy. In the exergue S.C.
 Found in Lincoln. Presented by the late B. Vickers, March, 1906.

39. *Obv.* As 38.
Rev. SALVTI AVGVSTOR. TR. P. XVII. A female figure feeding a serpent entwined round an altar, the left hand resting on sceptre. In the field S.C.

FAUSTINA THE YOUNGER, 161 to 175 A.D.

Daughter of Antoninus Pius, wife of M. Aurelius.

Rev. [PIETAS]. Faustina with cornucopia in left hand, Lucilla standing besides her on left (worn and defaced). In the field S.C.

Rev. [FECVND.] AVGVSTAE. Fertility facing left, holding two children in her arms, standing between two others. In the field S.C.

LUCIUS VERUS, 161 to 169 A.D.

42. A worn specimen. Head to right on the obverse, on the reverse a female seated.

Rev. P.M. TR. P. XVII. IMP. VIII. COS. VII. P.P. Fortune facing to left, holding caduceus in right hand, a cornucopia in left hand, her right foot on a prow. In the field a star and S.C.
 Found in Lincoln. Presented by Dr. E. Mansel Sympson, Oct., 1909.

44. *Obv.* M. COMMODVS [ANT. P.] FELIX AVG. B[RIT.] Laureate head to right.
Rev. P.M. TR. P. XII. [IMP. VIII.] COS. V. [P.P.] Fortune seated to left, holding rudder and cornucopia. In the field S.C. In the exergue FOR. RED. (Fortuna redux).
 Found in Lincoln. Presented by W. Priestley, July, 1908.

GORDIANUS THE THIRD, 238 to 244 A.D.

47. *Obv.* IMP. GORDIANVS PIVS FEL. AVG. Radiate head to right.
Rev. PROVIDENTIA AVG. Providence standing with left hand on sceptre, a globe at her feet.
 Found on the West Common, Lincoln, 1889.
 Presented by F. Williams, Sept. 28th, 1909.

PHILIP I, 244 to 249 A.D.

Sestertius.

48. *Obv.* IMP. M. IVL. PHILIPPVS AVG. Laureate head to right.
Rev. ANNONA AVG. Abundance standing to left, in her right hand ears of corn, at her feet a modius, in her left hand a cornucopia. In the field S.C.
 Found in Stonefield Garden, Lincoln. Presented by the late J. Swan, April 3rd, 1907.

VALERIANUS, 254 to 260 A.D.

Rev. IOVI CONSERVATORI. Jupiter standing with thunderbolt in right hand, hasta in left.

GALLIENUS, 253 to 268 A.D.
